TouroCOM Masters Student Simulation Internship Program

Title: TouroCOM Masters Student Medical Simulation Internship

Administration: Co-Directors and Faculty: Kelly Kohler, EMT-P, MS and Joyce Brown, DO, CHSE

Description: To provide TouroCOM Masters Students with exposure to clinical medicine, simulation and medical education via a predominantly hands on experience.

Objectives: Specific goals of the internship program are:

- 1. To gain exposure and experience using simulation as a tool for graduate medical education.
- 2. To observe and participate in the practical aspects of running simulations and a simulation center.
- 3. To interact with medical students and the Faculty in an educational and mentoring capacity.
- 4. To define and observe debriefing.
- 5. To observe the simulation based Inter-Professional Education activities that take place at TouroCOM.

Internship Duration: January 22nd, 2018 through the end of Spring 2018 Semester.

Time Commitment: Minimum of 3 hours a week (average). Max of 6 hours a week (can be flexible based on student academic needs).

Required Qualifications: 3.3 GPA for Fall Semester, interest in simulation, team player, completion of application.

Number of Internship Positions: 2-3

Examples of activities to meet Objectives:

Observe physical diagnosis course (including demonstrations and discussions of techniques). Assist with set-up and break down of simulation based physical diagnosis equipment in the Sim lab to become familiar with the equipment and techniques taught to 1st year DO students. This will include demonstrations and discussion of some of the techniques taught to the DO students by Department of Primary Care Faculty. Intern will have the opportunity to perform some of the techniques on the simulators. This will include operating the camera and helping to troubleshoot any simulation equipment issues during PD lab.

Coordinate the hands only CPR campaign amongst the Masters students.

Assist with set-up and break down of equipment in the Simulation lab. This will include demonstrations and discussion of some of the techniques taught to the 2nd year DO students by Department of Primary Care Faculty. Intern will have the opportunity to perform some of these techniques on the simulators.

Benefits to the Intern: Certificate of Completion, exposure to techniques and procedures taught to medical students, interaction with Primary Care Faculty, exposure to simulation education.
